1. The Company

DYNAMIC MARKETS is the trade mark of GLOBAL DYNAMIC MARKETS LIMITED.

References to the term "Company" throughout this policy relates to Global Dynamic Dynamic Limited.

The Company is duly incorporated under the laws of the Republic of Mauritius and bears Company registration number 179025 GBC. The Company is duly licensed by the Financial Services Commission of Mauritius and hold an Investment Dealer (Full Service Dealer, excluding Underwriting) licence with licence number GB21026278. The Company operates as an Investment Dealer.

The Company registered office address is C/o Accuvise Administrators Ltd, 7A Mayer Street, Port Louis, Republic of Mauritius.

2. What is a cookie?

In this policy we use the term "cookies" to refer to cookies and other similar technologies covered by the EU Directive on privacy in electronic communications.

A cookie is a small piece of data that a website asks your browser to store on your computer or mobile device. The cookie allows the website to "remember" your actions or preferences over time. They are not programs and cannot be executed as code or deliver viruses – instead, cookies act more like a passport, which the site checks and updates whenever you visit. Most websites which you visit will use cookies in order to improve your user experience.

Most Internet browsers support cookies; however, users can set their browsers to decline certain types of cookies or specific cookies. Further, users can delete cookies at any time.

3. Why do we use cookies?

We use cookies to learn how you interact with our content and to improve your experience when visiting our website. For example, some cookies remember your language or preferences so that you do not have to repeatedly make these choices when you visit our website. Additionally, cookies allow us to serve you specific content on our website.

4. What types of cookies do we use?



Cookies may be either "persistent" cookies or "session" cookies. The website uses both persistent and session cookies.

First-party cookies are cookies that are generally used to identify language and location preferences or render basic site functionality.

Third-party cookies belong to and are managed by other parties, such as service providers. These cookies may be required to render certain forms, such as the submission of a job application, or to allow for some advertising outside our website.

Session Cookies

Session cookies are stored temporarily during a browsing session and are deleted from the user's device when the browser is closed.

Persistent Cookies

Persistent cookies are used to remember your preferences within the website and remain on your desktop or mobile device even after you close your browser or restart your computer. Persistent cookies are saved on your computer for a fixed period (usually a year or longer) and are not deleted when the browser is closed (unless deleted by the user before the expiry date).

5. How are cookies used for advertising purposes?

Cookies and ad technology such as web beacons, pixels, and anonymous ad network tags help us serve relevant ads to you more effectively. They also help us collect aggregated audit data, research, and performance reporting for advertisers. Pixels enable us to understand and improve the delivery of ads to you, and know when certain ads have been shown to you. Since your web browser may request advertisements and web beacons directly from ad network servers, these networks can view, edit, or set their own cookies, just as if you had requested a web page from their site.

Although we do not use cookies to create a profile of your browsing behavior on third-party sites, we do use aggregate data from third parties to show you relevant, interest-based advertising. We do not provide any personal information that we collect to advertisers. You can opt out of off-site and third-party-informed advertising by adjusting your cookie settings. Opting out will not remove advertising from the pages you visit, but, instead, opting out will result in the ads you see not being matched to your interests. This implies that the ad(s) you see will not be matched to your interests by those specific cookies.

How are third party cookies used?

For some of the functions within our websites we use third party suppliers, for example, when you visit a page with videos embedded from or links to YouTube. These videos or links (and any other content from third party suppliers) may contain third party cookies, and we



encourage you to consult the privacy policies of these third party vendors on their websites for information regarding their use of cookies.

How do I change the cookies setting?

You can set or amend your web browser controls to accept or refuse cookies. If you choose to reject cookies, you may still use the website though your access to some functionality and areas of the website may be restricted. If you block cookies, you will not be able to use all the features on our website and trading platform. You can also delete cookies already stored on your computer. Again, doing this may have a negative impact on the usability of our services.

As the means by which you can refuse cookies through your web browser controls vary from browser-to-browser, you should visit your browser's help menu for more information. It is necessary to follow the instructions provided by the web browser, which are usually located within the 'Help', 'Tools' or 'Edit' menus.
